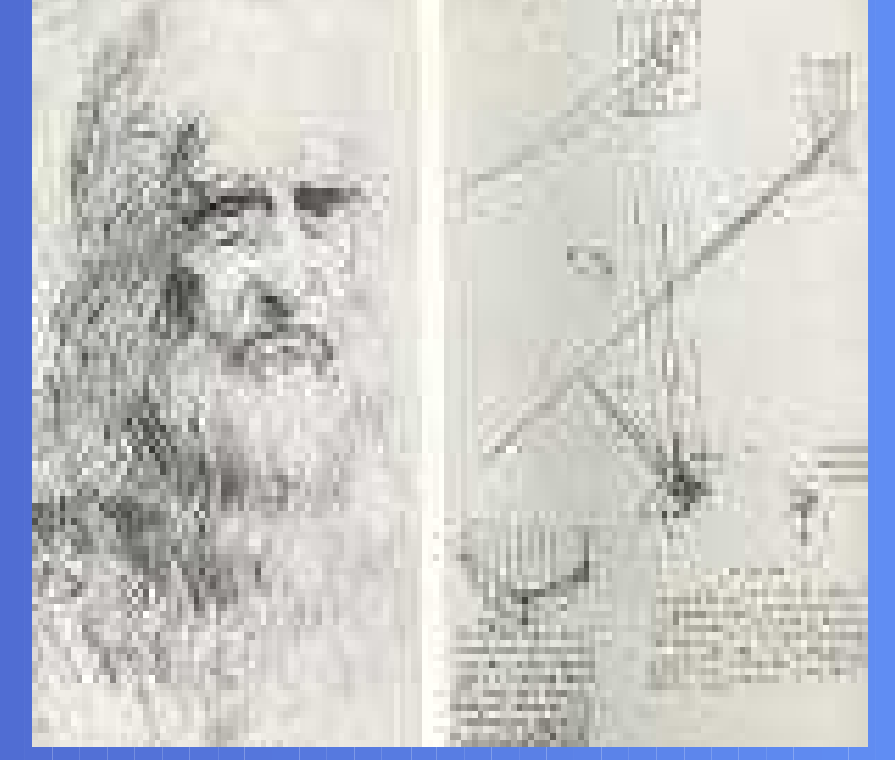

Objectives

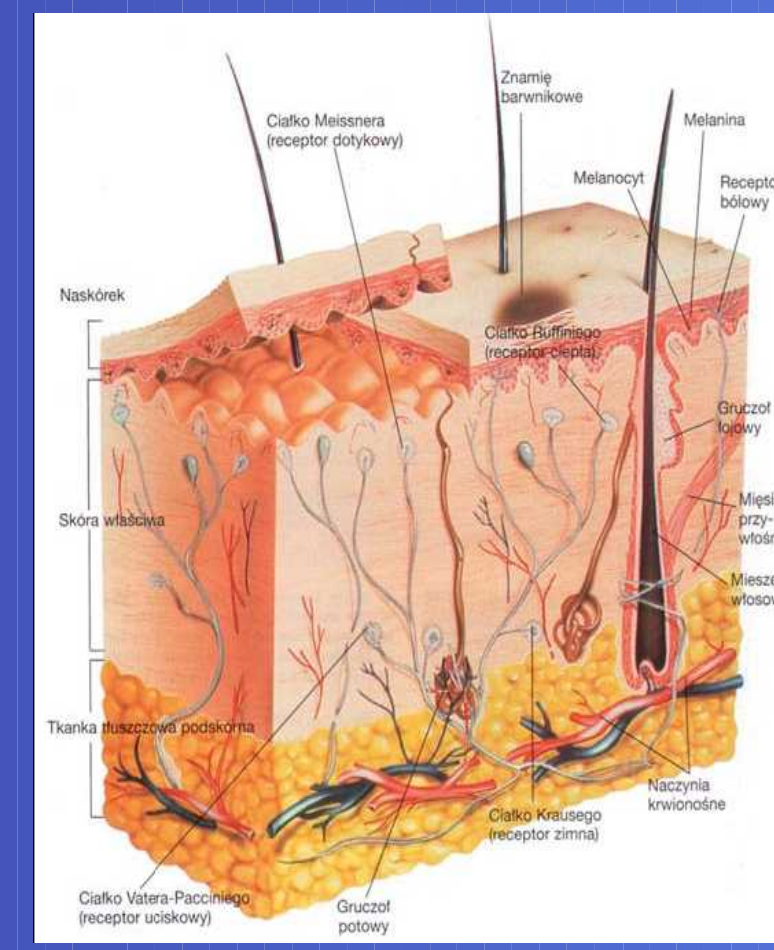


“Medskills” is an European Community Project included in the greater Leonardo da Vinci Project. The participants are six European Universities (Vrije Universiteit Brussel of Belgium, University of Liverpool from United Kingdom, Medical University of Poland, University of Athens, Greece, University di Perugia from Italy and Politechnical University from Madrid, Spain) and the Prehospital Emergency Medical Service of Madrid Council SAMUR-Civil Protection its also immersed. The main objective of this work is to disseminate the Medskills European Project LEONARDO DA VINCI.



Methodology

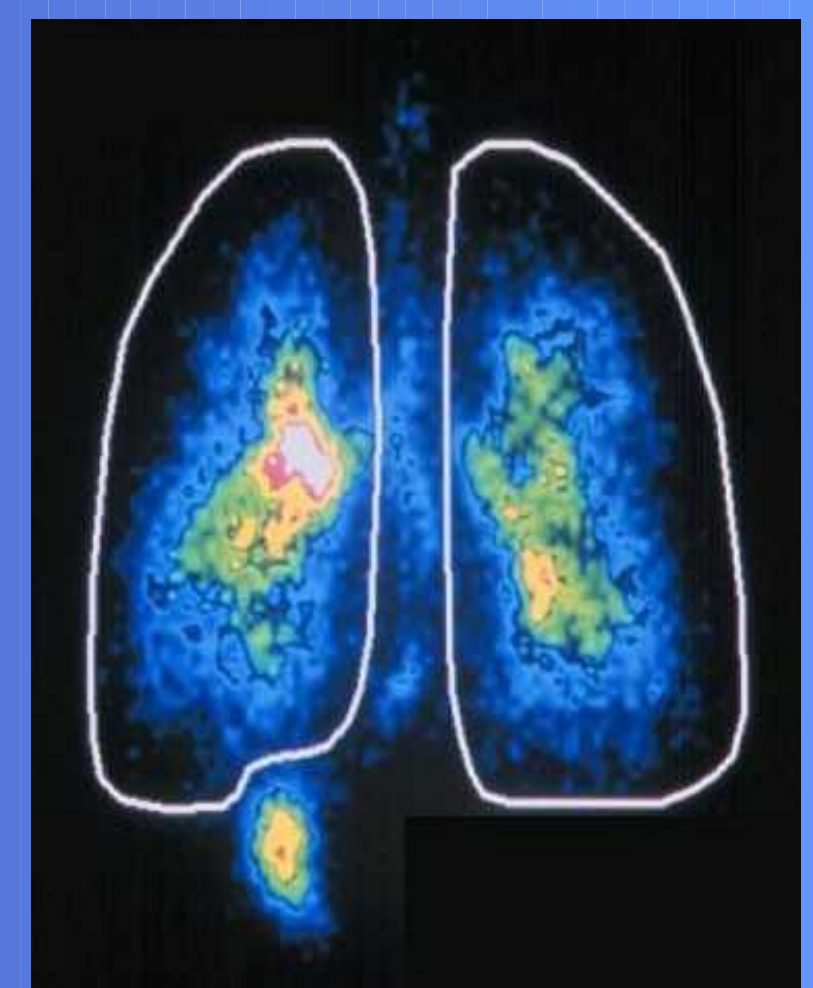
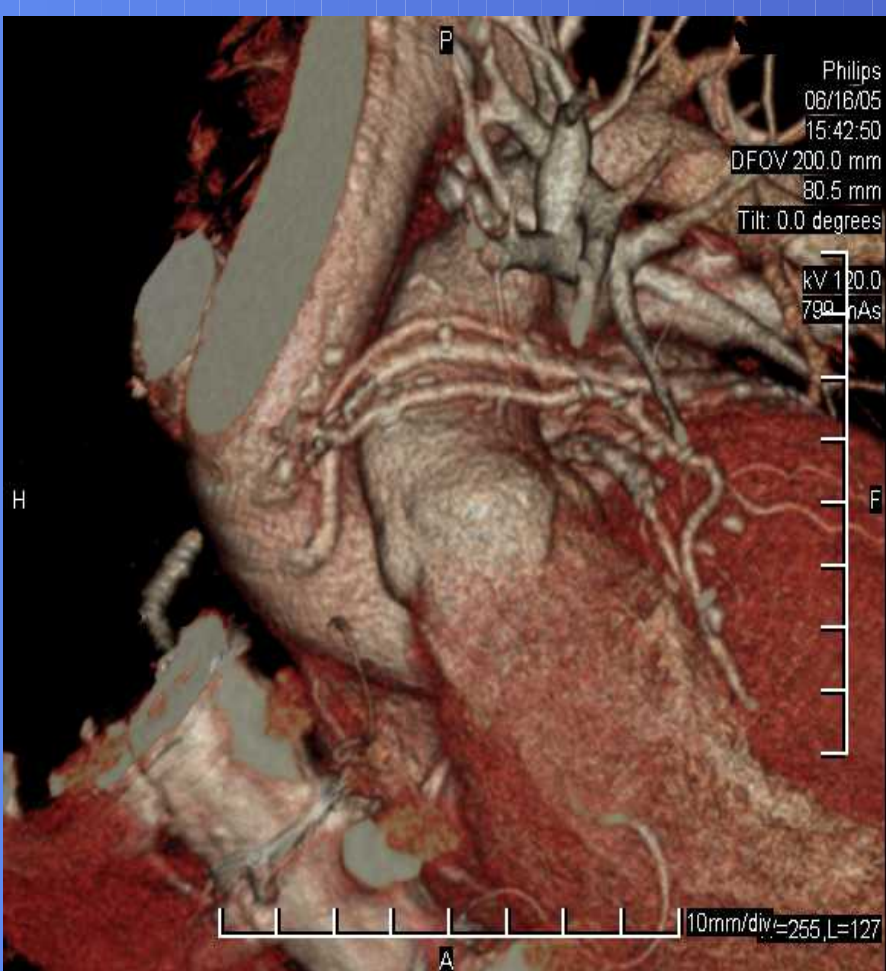
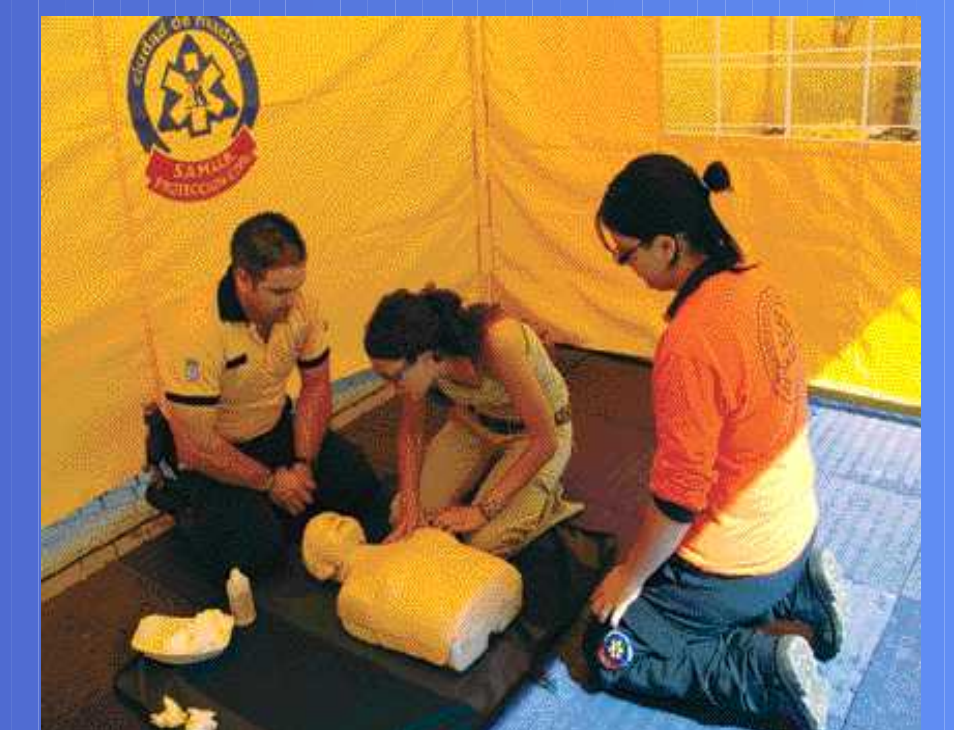
The project has a duration of three years, and it commenced on January, 2005. During the two first years the participants have been working in the generation of a web page that aims to provide free theoretical and practical teaching materials about emergency assistance (videos, images, audio files, virtual reality scenarios, etc), at all levels, from first-responder to medical professionals. The modules include Medical Fundamentals, Respiratory Problems, Trauma, Shock, Burns, Minor Surgery and Emergency Delivery, and all the topics are approached from cellular level, organ level and body level.



An essential condition is to provide high quality materials, addressing the level of scientific evidence and to provide audiovisual materials and to create virtual reality scenarios.

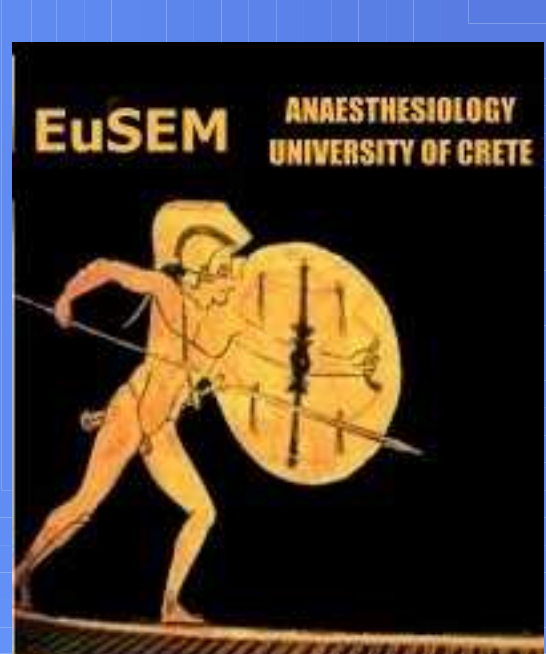
Results
